

In 2015, the journey of my career with the Ak-Chin Indian Community started with Ak-Chin Community Indian Security. From Security I was hired as an Ak-Chin Detention Officer where I spent almost three and a half years. From Ak-Chin Detention I was hired to become a Police Officer for the Ak-Chin Indian Community.

Due to the tragic pandemic, I was placed into Ak-Chin Police Department Dispatch. I worked as a Dispatcher for approximately one year.

Once the police academies opened back up from the pandemic, I was sent to the Maricopa County Police Academy in 2021. I graduated the police academy in 2022 and since have been a Police Officer with the Ak-Chin Police Department.

When I was given the




